Are you prepared for the risk of a home fire?

Heaters and Other Appliances

	Before every winter have chimneys and flues cleaned.
	Make sure all heaters are installed, maintained and operated according to manufacturer's instructions.
	Fire screens should always be placed in front of open fires and heaters in your home.
	Place items that could catch fire , like clothing and curtains, at least one metre away from heaters.
	Supervise children near all types of heating.
	All portable heating should be turned off and open fires extinguished before going to bed or leaving the house.
	Check all appliances are in good working order (using damaged electrical equipment and appliances can result in a fire).
	Ensure there are no overloaded power boards and damaged equipment is replaced.
	Check the lint filter in the clothes dryer is cleaned after each use.
Electric Blankets	
	Store your electric blankets correctly, if not stored and used correctly electric blankets may start fires.
	Store flat if possible and with nothing on top of it to damage wiring. When you take an electric blanket out in winter, check that the wires are completely flat and undamaged.
	Warm your bed by turning your electric blanket on for half an hour before you retire, then turn it off at the controls and the power source as you go to bed
