



BICYCLE SECURITY

To reduce your chances of becoming a victim of bike theft, consider the following crime prevention security tips:



Purchase and fit a good quality bike lock. Your bike dealer may be able to assist you in choosing a lock.



Always park and secure your bike in well-lit and populated areas.



Always lock the bike frame and both wheels to a secure object.



Engrave or mark your bike frame (near the serial number) with an ultraviolet (UV) pen, microdot or by other permanent means with your driver's licence number prefixed by the letter 'NT' for Northern Territory, e.g. NT123456.



Mark all your accessories, including helmet, lights, pump, saddle, etc.



Never leave your bike unattended and unlocked, even for a short period of time.



Take a photograph of your bike.



Complete the Bike Passport and keep it in a safe place. A Bike Passport records details of your bike to assist NT Police in identifying and returning it to you, if it is stolen. Visit www.police.nt.gov.au to download the Bike Passport.



When securing your bike, remove equipment including helmet, lights, pump, etc.



When at home, secure your bike in a locked shed or inside your house.
