

Prohibited Persons

(Including persons under the age of 18 years old)

A 'prohibited person' under *NT Firearms Act 1997* cannot take part in an Open Day at a Pistol Club, play Paintball or use a firearm under the supervision of a licence holder.

"Prohibited Person" means a person who:

- (a) is prohibited from applying for any licence under this Act or a law of a State or another Territory; or
- (b) is not entitled to be granted any licence under this Act, for a reason other than that the person is not a resident, or about to become a resident, of the Territory.

Persons who are prohibited from applying for a licence or are not entitled to be granted a licence under the Firearms Act include those who have been:

- subject of a Domestic Violence Order in the last 5 years (In the Northern Territory the 5 year period applies from when the Order expired, not when it came into force),
- currently subject to an order to 'keep the peace' issued by a court,
- been found guilty of an offence against the NT *Firearms Act 1997* or the NT *Weapons Control Act 2001* in the last 2 years (a finding of guilt includes where the offence was proved and no conviction recorded),
- been found guilty of an Offence of Violence in the last 5 years (Carefully read the list of Offences of Violence to see if this applies to you. A finding of guilt includes matters where the offence was proved and no conviction recorded),
- been found guilty of a Disqualifying Offence in the last 10 years (Carefully read the list of Disqualifying
 Offences to see if this applies to you. A finding of guilt includes matters where the offence was proved and
 no conviction recorded),
- currently subject to a court order that you cannot hold or apply for a firearm licence, or
- currently under a Notice of Suspension, Refusal or Revocation issued under the NT Firearms Act 1997.

If the above applies to you, or you think it may apply to you, DO NOT complete the 'Prohibited Person' declaration. You are not eligible to play paintball, shoot under a Firearm Club Open Day Permit or use a firearm under the supervision of a licence holder (ie – safari hunting).
