



SAFETY TIPS FOR QUAD BIKE RIDERS



Always wear the correct protective gear including a helmet, jacket, pants, boots and gloves



Undertake training or have sufficient experience before operating a quad bike



Ride to the conditions - you should have sufficient strength, weight and agility to ride safely and react quickly



Never ride double - sharing a single seat can make a quad bike hard to handle



Keep the wheels on the ground at all times



Don't ride on the road unless you're registered to do so

Police are targeting vehicles driving on roads and verges without registration.

IT IS ILLEGAL TO DRIVE A QUAD BIKE ON A PUBLIC ROAD OR PUBLIC PLACE INCLUDING A PARK, BEACH OR FOOTPATH - UNLESS YOU HAVE A CONDITIONAL REGISTRATION. *Avoid the fine!*

You can apply for conditional registration for a quad bike or all-terrain vehicles (ATV) for work related purposes.

You can apply for work related purposes including any of the following:

- roadside litter collection
- herbicide spraying
- ground maintenance
- park management

Driving on wet roads or rough terrain is not regarded as a sufficient reason for conditional registration.
