

COLLECTORS LICENCE INFORMATION & REQUIREMENTS

A Firearm Collectors Licence authorises the holder to possess and display only firearms of a category specified, and must only collect firearms:

- as curiosities or ornaments, or
- for their historic or artistic or mechanical uniqueness.

In order to qualify for a Firearm Collectors Licence you must produce evidence to the Commissioners satisfaction **every time you apply** or reapply that you have a genuine reason for the licence and for possessing and collecting firearms. You will also be expected to complete a firearm safety course.

An applicant for, or holder of, a Firearm Collectors Licence must be a member of an approved society or club the members of which collect firearms. The only approved society at this time is the Arms Collectors Association of the NT [ACA-NT] - 0413727133 or secretary@acant.org.au. If you cease to be a member of ACA-NT your licence will be revoked.

Normally collectors licences will only be issued for categories A, B, C & H – not Category D firearms. Category D firearms may only be collected on specifically accredited licences approved on a case by case basis after being a Collector for more than 5 years with a 'student of arms' endorsement.

This licence will not permit the collection of Category H (handguns) manufactured after 1st January 1947 – unless the applicant is endorsed by the Arms Collectors Association of the NT as a 'student of arms'.

A person may be considered to be a 'student of arms' if the person:

- is the holder of a firearms collector licence,
- can demonstrate regular attendance at meetings and participation in displays held by the society,
- can demonstrate that the person's firearms collection has a thematic structure and historical or commemorative value.
- possesses a research library and/or contributes to the society's literature on the theme of the collection held, and
- is, and has been for at least 12 months, a member of an approved historical firearms collector's society and that society recognises the person to be a **student of arms**.

The following documentation is required in support of your application every time you apply:

- A copy of your <u>current Arms Collectors Association Card</u> and where applicable that needs to have the 'student of arms' endorsement; **and**
- A letter outlining the reason for wanting the Firearm Collectors Licence which outlines the theme and/or
 the structure and historical or commemorative value of the proposed collection. <u>A current, dated</u>
 and signed comprehensive theme letter is to be supplied with each application.

Your premises must comply with the storage and safe keeping requirements as specified for the collector's licence under the *Firearms Act.* To ensure compliance police will inspect on <u>each</u> application or on an as required basis. *Fill out and attach a <u>PF482</u> – Permission to Inspect Premises.*

In order to prevent any delays in processing your application, please ensure that you provide all of the required documentation in support of your application. To reapply for a new collectors licence do so well before your current licence expires and include a self-audit of your collectors firearms.
